## **TIDBITS FROM MR. DEPAOLA**

I would like to advise you of some changes planned for the 2013-14 school year.

### **Start Time**

Due to the need for more time after school, the start time of school will be slightly adjusted. Beginning in the fall, the start time for first period will be 8:00 am (0 period will begin at 7:20 am). The school day will officially end at 2:57 pm.

### **Extra Help**

Our current school schedule allows for students to receive extra help after regularly scheduled classes on Tuesdays and Thursdays (Wednesdays as well, but this is currently used for club meeting time). Although many students take advantage of these small group learning opportunities, some do not and leave the building before the official end of the school day. With that in mind, we will employ the following:

- On Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays classes will be shortened from 43 minutes to 41 minutes with a 1-minute homeroom. Teachers will be available for extra help session from 2:33 pm to 2:57 pm.
- Students in grades 7-11 will need to stay in the building during this time period. The library, computer rooms, and cafeterias will be staffed for students who choose not to see a teacher.
- Students in grade 12 who are passing all of their classes will have the privilege of leaving at 2:33 pm on those days if they are not in need of extra help services. A one-time parent permission slip will be distributed and collected in September. This privilege may be revoked due to disciplinary infractions.

Extra help during the school day will remain unchanged.

### **Clubs and Sports**

Carle Place offers a comprehensive array of clubs and athletic opportunities for our students. In order for these to occur outside of the official school day, the following changes will be implemented:

The start/end time of the school day will be adjusted (see above). All clubs will meet either before school or after school (before 8:00am – after 2:57pm). There will no longer be club meetings on Wednesdays during extra help sessions.

The start time for sports will remain the same – 3:30 pm. On Wednesdays, they will begin at 3:45 pm except for scrimmages and games.
