AMERICA'S MOST CHALLENGING HIGH SCHOOL

I am proud to announce that Carle Place High School has been included in the Washington Post's ranking of America's Most Challenging High Schools.

This was based upon the academic record of the Class of 2015. The Washington Post ranks schools through a simple formula: the number of Advanced Placement tests given at a school each year, divided by the number of seniors who graduated that year. With over 700 school districts in the entire state of New York, and many more high schools, Carle Place was ranked 71st. This was a 24 place jump from the previous year. What is more impressive is that of the schools included in the ranking, Carle Place students earned the 36th highest Equity & Excellence (E&E) score. This ranks the number of students who score a 3 or higher on any one AP test.

TEACHERS MAKE A DIFFERENCE

Mrs. Lorandini, math teacher, is the recipient of the 2016 LIMACON Educator Award. This award is given to an educator in recognition of extensive high quality service to Mathematics Education. Mrs. Lorandini has also recently become a New York State Master Teacher. She has led workshop sessions on Long Island, and at state, regional and national conferences.

Mrs. Gisondi, English teacher, was recognized on April 28 at Sacred Heart Academy in honor of their Middle School Teachers Appreciation Celebration. Mrs. Gisondi was selected by Sara Micheli, one of her former students, as a teacher who has had a positive impact on her life.

CLASSROOM LEARNING

Nassau County Legislator Laura Schaeffer visited Mrs. Rubenstein’s Participation in Government class to discuss the legislative process on the county level. The students will be working with Legislator Schaeffer to discuss possible legislative initiatives and projects for Carle Place.

Mr. Buonpane’s AP Environmental class was fortunate enough to host a discussion with Mr. Keith McCoy, Operations Manager for Small Clean Power Plants (SCPP) for the New York Power Authority. Mr. McCoy oversees the operation of ten SCPP’s in the State of New York. Mr. McCoy gave a sixty minute presentation on energy production, Mr. McCoy also explained the processes of hydroelectric and natural gas electrical energy production. The students had the opportunity for a question and answer session. His visit had a positive impact on the students and deepened their knowledge of energy production.

The students in Mr. Morris’ AP English Language and Composition class and Mrs. Caliendo’s AP US History class took a tour of the Conservatory Garden and reservoir in Central Park before embarking on an adventure to the Metropolitan Museum of Art. The students viewed the full room mural of Thomas Hart Benton’s *America Today*, which depicts the social, economic, industrial and agricultural concerns of 1920’s America. Students did preparatory reading and research prior to their visit.

Mr. Jason Smith, the school’s architect, recently presented to the students in Mrs. Norman’s Architecture class and Mr. Tonner’s Technology class. He discussed the ongoing school projects and his presentation included real world examples of issues faced by architects during the design and construction process.

On April 22nd, Mr. Bob Chiappone, a member of The Military Order of the Purple Heart for wounds sustained during the Vietnam War, visited the high school to discuss his wartime experiences with Mr. Woythaler’s English 12 classes and Mr. Morris’s Literature of the 1960’s elective class. This presentation supplemented the students’ reading of Tim O’Brien’s novel of the war, *The Things They Carried*, published in 1990. In addition to sharing intimate stories of the war, students were treated to Mr. Chiappone’s scrapbooks and personal memorabilia such as his flak jacket that he attributes to saving his life.

On May 13, 2016, 10th grade AP World History students, the Key Club officers, the Student Organization and Battle of the Classes, Battling for a Cause top fundraisers attended a field trip to the September 11th memorial and St. Paul’s Church in New York City. Students learned about terrorism and human rights violations prior to attending this trip. In addition to visiting the memorial, students were fortunate to have Mr. Robert Jarvis, Carle Place alumni, coordinate a tour of the Oculus by the Port Authority.

Mrs. Klatsky's English 10H class studied William Shakespeare's *Macbeth* and then traveled to CW Post/LIU to see a performance of the play by the professional traveling troupe Shakespeare and Company.

SERVICE LEARNING/COMMUNITY SERVICE

Mrs. Caliendo's Women's Studies class is supporting "It's On Us" and working to raise awareness at Carle Place High School using social media, videos, posters, and creating a pledge to take the promise to do what you can to prevent sexual assault. The name "It's On Us" shows that it's up to US to stop sexual assault, whether it be in college, protecting our friends at parties, or supporting a victim to help them get through it. "It's On Us" is a non-profit organization dedicated to raising awareness for sexual assault. Many celebrities have been involved in this campaign such as Kerry Washington, Nina Dobrev, Josh Hutcherson, Randy Jackson, and even President Obama.

Students in Mr. Morris' English 11 AP classes created care packages and letters of support for US veterans residing at the VA Hospital in Northport. Students read *All Quiet on the Western Front* to appreciate the author's style and the theme of the horrors of war and its toll on individual humans, regardless of nationality. Their reading of the novel is complemented with classic war-themed poetry. Using Service Learning Grant funds, students purchased food and personal care items to send veteran care packages with hand-written notes to thank them for their service. The packages were delivered to a local VFW organization.

From January to April, under the direction of Jenique Nijboer, art teacher, 15 art students were selected to participate in a service learning project for children living in Bolivia. The program, "The Memory Project," is a unique initiative in which selected talented CP art students work from photographs to create individual portraits (drawings, paintings, digital art, etc.) for children and teens from around the world who have been orphaned, neglected, or disadvantaged in some way. The portraits along with photos of the CP artists were mailed to the Bolivian children in May.

Our Life Skills Class organized a clothing and hygiene products drive for our veterans. They collected these items and donated them to the VA Hospital in Northport.

On February 26, 2016, the students of Carle Place High School participated in Battle of the Classes—Battling for a Cause. The event is run by the Student Organization, advisor Ms. Fallik; Elisabeth Bulzomi, president; Sophia Urrutia, vice president; Julia Beattie, secretary; and Ryan Hopkins, treasurer; and the Key Club Organization, advisor Ms. Buffalino; Thomas Vestuto, president; Vincent Basso, vice president; Nick Antoniou, treasurer; Pragna Krishnamurthy, secretary; and Savannah Weilert and Kayla Yim, public relations.

September 2016 will mark the 15th anniversary of the terrorist attacks on the World Trade Center. Consequently, this year Carle Place High School's 9th annual Battle of the Classes, Battling for a Cause event honors those affected by this tragic day. Carle Place Student Organization and Key Club officers chose Tuesday's Children as this year's beneficiary of fundraising efforts. Tuesday's Children was founded to promote long-term healing for all those directly impacted by the events of Tuesday, September 11, 2001. An estimated 3,051 children lost a parent on 9/11.

The evening of February 26, 2016 was filled with fun, spirit, and competition and truly exhibited how our small town can really come together for an important cause. The students of Carle Place High School were able to raise \$20,000 for Tuesday's Children. The goal of the Student Organization and Key Club was to raise awareness of the impact of 9/11 and to keep alive the memories of those affected. Student Organization and Key Club leaders are sure that the night and cause will be remembered forever.

Over 33,000 responders and survivors have faced and continue to face 9/11-related illnesses. The students chose a foundation close to the community's heart. Many families in town and employees of the Carle Place School District were affected by 9/11 in some way. Congratulations to our top fundraiser, Gabriella Murray and to the Class of 2016 for winning the 2016 Battle of the Classes, Battling for a Cause. Carle Place High School will display a Flag Field of Honor in September 2016 in remembrance of 9/11.

On Saturday, May 7, 2016, The Carle Place High School Student Organization held their annual Senior Citizen Luncheon under the direction of Ms. Erika Fallik. The senior citizens of Carle Place enjoyed an afternoon of great food, fun music and exciting games of bingo. SO treasurer, Ryan Hopkins, played his guitar and sang for the crowd. He ended his outstanding performance with a group sing along to the song, "Hey Jude," by the Beatles. The colorful spring decorations and all of the smiling faces gave the room a contagious, happy vibe. Student leaders served the guests a delicious catered lunch and helped throughout the entire event. Carle Place High School's mascot, Carly Passion, even stopped by to join in on the fun! Undoubtedly, the student leaders of Carle Place High School enjoyed spending the afternoon with our beloved Carle Place Seniors. SERVICE LEARNING/COMMUNITY SERVICE

The Key Club was recognized by the New York District Key Club at their 68th Annual Leadership Training Conference in Albany in March.
