STUDENTS MAKING THEIR MARK

Nicole Cunha, Sarah Giglio, Eileen Liang and Shannon Weilert, grade 12, were honored at Nassau County’s Holocaust Remembrance Day Commemoration on April 13, 2015 at Hofstra University.

Ryan Hopkins, grade 11, has been selected to be our representative at the 2015 Boys State by the American Legion committee.

Ingrid Corado, grade 11, was named Student of the Quarter of Nassau BOCES Barry Tech. Ingrid was honored for her second quarter grades, attendance, work ethic and preparedness.

Francesca Venezia, grade 7, received an Honors Award at the Long Island Science Congress.

TEACHERS MAKE A DIFFERENCE

Mrs. Perifimos, world language teacher, will be a presenter at the national conference, Addressing the Needs of a Changing Profession, in Denver in July. This conference is sponsored by the American Association of Teachers of Spanish and Portuguese.

CLASSROOM LEARNING

Mrs. Klatsky’s and Ms. Buffalino’s ninth and tenth graders received a visit from Senator Jack Martins on February 4. The students had written Senator Martins letters opposing the proposed casino in Westbury. Senator Martins visited the students to discuss the importance of staying involved and informed.

Nassau County Legislator Laura Schaeffer visited Mrs. Rubenstein’s Participation in Government class to discuss the legislative process on the county level. The students will be working with Legislator Schaeffer to discuss possible legislative initiatives and projects for Carle Place.

The students in Mrs. Caliendo’s American History class remembered the importance of the “50th Anniversary of the March on Selma.” This civil rights action of non-violence was commemorated by a “gallery walk” of visual exhibits, musical anecdotes of the period, video clips and lessons. The students were then encouraged to create a protest sign that they would be proud to stand behind at a rally. These posters, photographs and words of inspiration from the civil rights leaders such as: Rosa Park, Martin Luther King, Jr., and John Lewis, were prominently displayed in the hallway of the school. This “hands on” way to learn about the civil rights movement was fun, effective and inspiring. It was also pertinent and relevant in light of the “protests” we are constantly seeing in the news today.

Mr. Buonpane’s AP Environmental class was fortunate enough to host a discussion with Mr. Keith McCoy, Operations Manager for Small Clean Power Plants (SCPP) for the

New York Power Authority. Mr. McCoy oversees the operation of ten SCPP’s in the State of New York. Mr. McCoy gave a ninety-minute presentation on energy production, transmission, efficiency and the technology and regulations that have been implemented to reduce the environmental impact of energy production across New York. Mr. McCoy also explained the processes of hydroelectric and natural gas electrical energy production. The students had the opportunity for a question and answer session. His visit had a positive impact on the students and deepened their knowledge of energy production.

Ms. Cole’s pre-calculus class participated in a graphic design project using their graphing calculators to create logos to advertise a product of their choice. The project taught the students about conic sections and how circles, lines, etc. can be limited in order to create pictures in their graphing calculators.

The students in Mr. Morris’ AP English Language and Composition class and Mrs. Caliendo’s AP US History class took a tour of the Conservatory Garden and reservoir in Central Park before embarking on an adventure to the Metropolitan Museum of Art. The students viewed the full room mural of Thomas Hart Benton’s *America Today*, which depicts the social, economic, industrial and agricultural concerns of 1920’s America. Students did preparatory reading and research prior to their visit.

Ms. Buffalino’s AP World History class attended a field trip to the September 11 memorial in New York City. The students attended this trip after completing their human rights violations unit and modern terrorism in depth.

SERVICE LEARNING/COMMUNITY SERVICE

On February 27, 2015, the students of Carle Place High School participated in Battle of the Classes—Battling for a Cause. The event is run by the Student Organization, advisor Ms. Fallik; Lucas Golon, president; Sahil Kadakia, vice president; Sarah Pisani, secretary; and Daniel Mattondo, treasurer; and the Key Club Organization, advisor Ms. Buffalino; Shannon Weilert, president; Melissa Choi, vice president; Nick Antoniou, treasurer; Vincent Basso, secretary; and Elisabeth Bulzomi, Nicole Grima and Thomas Vestuto, public relations.

This year’s cause was the SuperTy Foundation, which aims to fund research for cancer treatments specific towards pediatrics. Mrs. Campbell is the founder of the organization and created it in memory of her son, Tyler Louis Campbell. The organization aims to find pediatric cancer treatments that work without robbing children of their childhood. The students raised \$25,558 for this cause. The Student Organization and Key Club thank and congratulate Augie Cavallaro who fundraised \$5,000 for SuperTy. Augie has been the top fundraiser for the past four years and has fundraised over \$18,000.

SERVICE LEARNING/COMMUNITY SERVICE

The Student Organization, under the leadership of Ms. Fallik, hosted their annual Senior Citizens Luncheon on May 9. Over 80 senior citizens attended this event. The student leaders served lunch and dessert, mingled and played bingo. Ryan Hopkins and Sydney Perruzza entertained the seniors with their musical selections. A great time was enjoyed by all. Special thanks to all the student officers and leaders.

On Saturday, March 21, 17 members and four advisors of the SPARC/Interact Club from Carle Place High School and Mineola High School gathered together to volunteer their time helping out Habitat-for-Humanity. The club members assisted adult volunteers and professional staff of Habitat as they renovated an abandoned house in Roosevelt. The group's work included: breaking up concrete to make way for a new driveway, painting and insulating the basement, digging post holes and installing a fence, installing basement windows and, of course, cleaning snow and debris. In mid-March, News 12 LI reporter Elizabeth Hashagen visited Carle Place High School to interview students in the SPARC/Interact Club and their advisor, Mr. Morris, to create a feature story for News 12's monthly edition of "12 Making a Difference." The story, which aired on March 27, focused on the club's community service efforts on behalf of Habitat-for-Humanity, The INN, Ronald McDonald House, US Veterans and service personnel, as well as our local senior citizens. This trip was a multi-school service project with Mineola High School. In late May, SPARC/Interact Carle Place and Mineola members gathered at Carle Place High School to bake cookies for the families and children at the Ronald McDonald House.

The Student Organization hosted an assembly on April 1 featuring motivational speaker Ted Weise. Known as one of America's best youth leadership development speakers, Mr. Weise works with thousands of students every year to teach and enhance their leadership skills. Mr. Weise is in the business of making students believe they can make a difference—and he teaches them how to do it.

On April 24, 2015, the Key Club, under the advisorship of Ms. Buffalino, held their annual Fundraising Through Fashion Show. Over 100 high school students and staff participated in the event including members of the Student Organization, SPARC/Interact and Tri-M. The event fund-raised money for Victoria Monteforte, who is a 2 year old child from Carle Place with a disease called Idiopathic

Thrombocytopenia Purpura. Victoria's mom, Lisa Sterlacci Monteforte, is a member of the Class of 1999. The fashion show raised over \$17,300 for ITP awareness and Victoria's treatments.

The Key Club participated in a Bowl-a-Thon at Herrill Lanes on March 8. Fifty members bowled to raise awareness for pediatric cancer and to raise funds for Penelope's Odyssey. Penelope's Odyssey is an Oceanside based organization that aims to provide social and emotional support for children and families battling pediatric cancer.

On April 22, 2015, the Environmental Action Club hosted their Annual Earth Day Walk on the high school track. This was a great opportunity for everyone to walk away from their computers and enjoy the wonders of our patch of earth.

On March 20, 2015, members of SADD participated in Grim Reaper Day. This event reminds students of the dangers of drunk driving. A gong sounded every 30 minutes to represent another loss of life through drunk driving.
